#### **Lower Elementary (Pre K-3)**


Read the book together or have your child read the book to you. Ask questions about how the characters use the habits.

- Create a cozy, realizing environment that encourages reading.
- Store books in a visible location at home.
- Talk to your student about what you're reading, both for work and personal life.



## **Pathway for Success**

- Standards-Based Grading provides meaningful feedback so both students and parents can track progress toward mastery of academic standards and reflect upon strengths and areas for improvement.
- Standards-based grading communicates how students are performing on a set of clearly defined learning targets.
- You will see scores categorized as formative or summative. Formative assessments may include quick checks, review and teacher observations and are weighted at 0%. Summative assessments may include end-of-unit tests, common assessments, and projects. They are counted toward the final grade in the gradebook and are weighted at 100%.
